Stockholm, Sweden

Members and friends of the European Finance Association are welcome to submit research papers to be considered for presentation at the 2011 Annual Meetings. Papers on any topic related to finance will be considered. Papers should be submitted electronically at the EFA 2011 conference web site, www.efa2011.org, which contains instructions for paper submission, payment of the submission fee, and other information.

The deadline for submissions is midnight EST on February 15, 2011.

In addition to the regular program there will be two special sessions on **Household Finance** co-organized with the **Institute for Financial Research (SIFR)**. The **European Central Bank (ECB)** will also sponsor a few sessions on **Systemic Risk and Macro-prudential Oversight**, including empirical and theoretical macro-financial models with realistic characterizations of financial instability and models of systemic risk using non-standard approaches (e.g. agent-based models, econophysics, and psychology).
